



where would you go?






Would you go to one of these places?

Just like the little girl in our story you are going to draw your own adventure today.




What will you draw to start your adventure?

Draw something to help us escape from the monster with your magic crayon.




How will we

Here is what we are going to make.



Here is what we are going to need:

- Paper or card
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Glue or stick tape
- Coloured pens or pencils
- Template


Next, we
have to cut
the top
strip off
and save it
for later.



Now we need to fold the paper in half, just like in the picture.




Next we need to cut along the lines, but making sure we leave a gap at the bottom so that our lantern doesn't fall apart.



You can ask an adult to help you do this with scissors.

Open your lantern out and wrap the paper into a cylinder like this.



Tape the edges in place. You can use glue, tape or even staples if an adult can help you.



Now we need the strip we put to one side. This is going to be our handle. Tape the handle to the top of your lantern.



Now we have our lantern. You can make as many as you like in lots of different sizes. Here are some ideas.
