The Curriculum

The Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum is divided into 7 areas of learning:

Prime Areas:

- 1. Personal, social and emotional development
- 2. Physical Development
- 3. Communication and Language

Specific Areas:

- 4. Literacy
- 5. Mathematics
- 6. Understanding the world
- 7. Expressive Arts & Design



In the Reception classes the different areas are usually integrated, although phonics, literacy and mathematics have separate sessions. This half term we are looking at the topic of 'Growing' and 'Mini-beasts', and next half term we will be basing our topic work around 'Pirates' and 'Travel'.

Skills for Life

Whatever we teach we aim to encourage the development of the following skills, taken in their broadest sense: **looking**, **asking questions**, **finding out**, **organising**, **making connections**, **having a go and sharing**.



Both classes have a half day each week in Forest School, this is a fantastic opportunity for the children to develop their independent learning in a natural

environment whilst enriching the curriculum. All of the children enjoy the activities areas like the climbing wall, the rope swing and so much more. We are also working in creating a second Forest School site. Please visit the Forest School section of the website for more details and pictures.



Reading and Writing



We are continuing with the Letters and Sounds teaching program to teach reading and writing. Please continue to revise the sounds and key words with your child at home, as this encouragement at home is absolutely essential.

We are also teaching cursive handwriting from the Letter Join scheme. A sheet has been handed out at both October and March parent's evenings that demonstrates how the letters are formed.


Maths

mathematicians we aim have thorough to understanding of numbers to 20 and beyond, counting forwards and backwards in 2's, 5's and 10's, placing these in order and saying which is one more or one less than a given number. We are also teaching the children to add and subtract.



The concepts of pattern, shape, measure and classification are taught across the curriculum.

Helping your child at home

As well as listening to your child read, reading aloud to your child is an extremely valuable activity as it gives the child access to books they are not able to read on their own. Non- fiction is just as useful as fiction; read whatever your child is interested in!
