**Skills and topics covered:** 4 operations, percentages, measures, geometry and fractions.

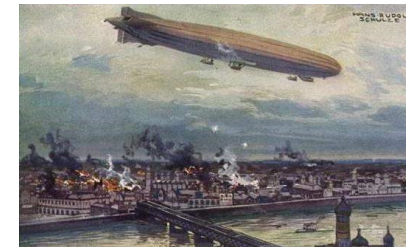
We will be applying these skills through problem solving which will help them to develop their reasoning skills.

We will be looking at how WW1 affected everybody and the changes it created in society. A significant part of the topic will involve respect and remembrance, especially because of the anniversary of the armistice.



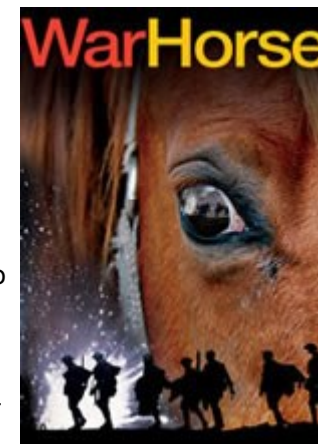
### English

We will be exploring the story, relating it to our topic, and creating many different genres of writing from it. We will create newspaper reports, write fact files about key information, create and act out scripts for key scenes as well as creating our own stories based around the ideas in War Horse.
