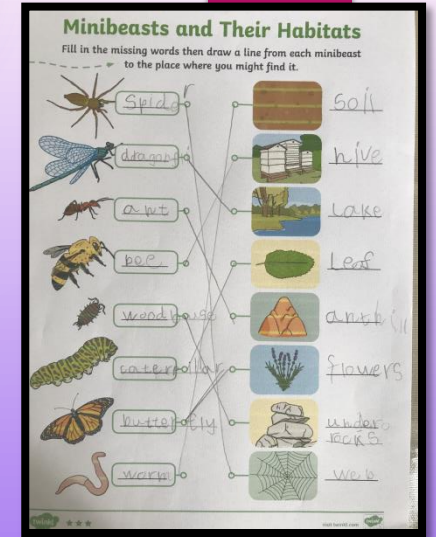
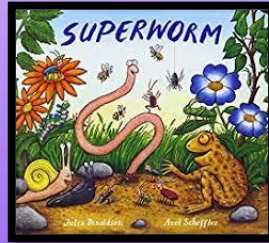

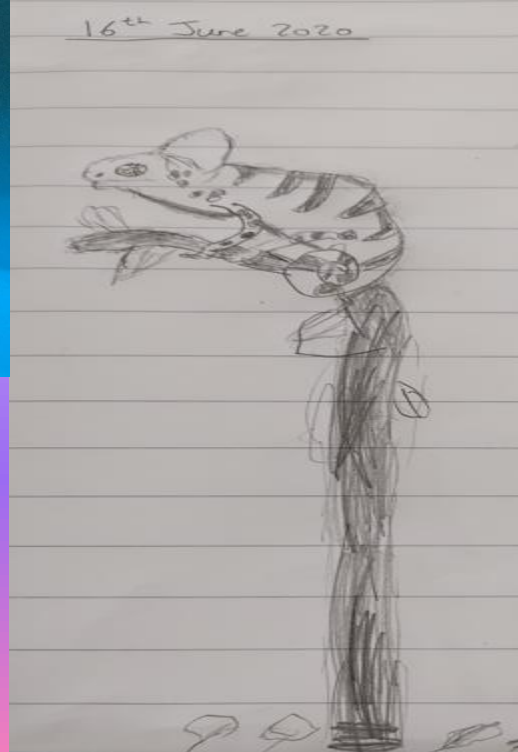

The bees replied "yes yes, we have got something!"

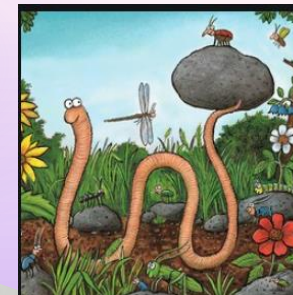
"What would you like to see me do?" he asked.

I would go to travel around with him and see the top from only half way down the mountain or I will go round europe and Africa to introduce his friends or I will rampage the supermarket and get bread by food.

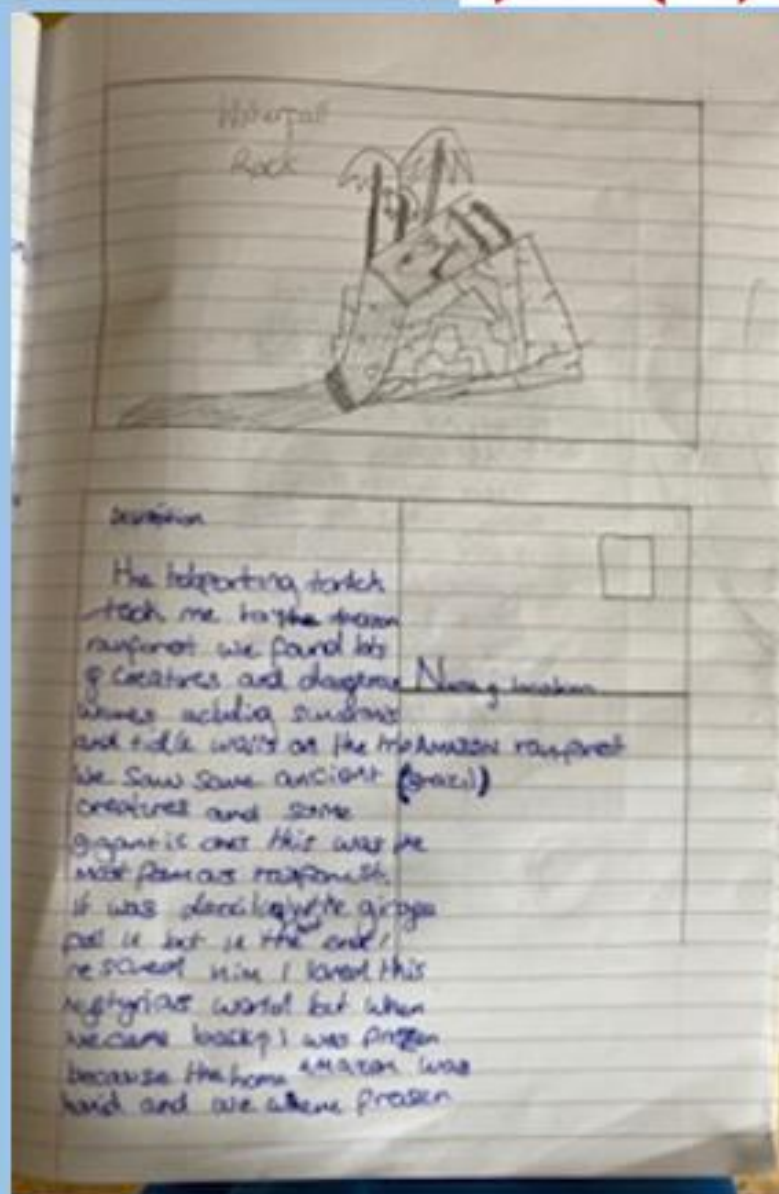

Blue-Headed Iguanas, although uncommon, are easy to identify, as they are a mixture of four distinct animals.
They have the head of a Blue Iguana, the body of a Giganotosaurus, the legs of a frog and a tail resembling a snake. Furthermore, they are also related to the Southern Tree Agamas, commonly known as blue headed lizards.
Additionally, although their legs closely resemble those of a frog, they have scales on them, which means they are part reptile and ~~part~~ amphibian!
You may not be aware but Blue-Headed Iguanas bob their heads slowly up and down to acknowledge each other's presence; However, if they feel threatened, they whip their tails to protect themselves and, if necessary, escape from predators by climbing trees.
Moreover, they are herbivores who need water to survive, and obtain this from the plant matter that they consume, such as leaves, flowers and some fruits, which they find in the wild.
