

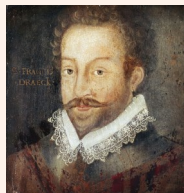
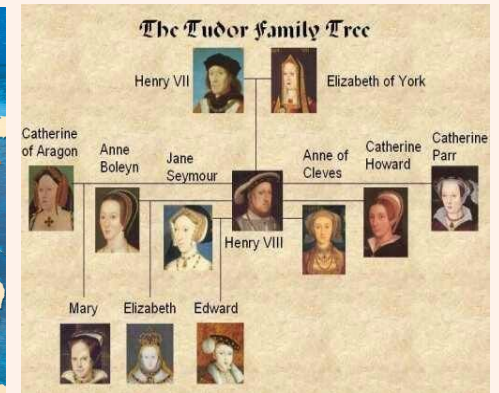
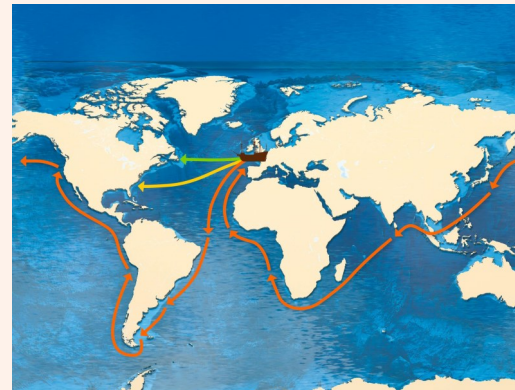
Who were the Tudors what impact did they have on our lives?

Circumnavigation	a complete navigation around the world by sail	Privateer	captain or crew member of a private, armed ship authorised to attack and capture enemy ships and cargo
Flagship	the ship which carries the commander of a fleet	New World	Continents of North and South America dominated by Spain
Latitude	the measurement of distance north or south of the Equator	Galleon	Large warship
Monarch	ruler, usually a king or queen	Monarchy	A system of government that has a king or queen at its head.
Salvage	to rescue items from shipwrecks, fires or other disasters	Dynasty	A family of rulers who rule over a country for a long time
Scurvy	a disease resulting from a lack of Vitamin C	Successor	A person who inherits the throne after the death of the previous king or queen
Pole Star (or North Star)	a star useful for navigation as it remains at the same spot above the northern horizon year-round	Catholic	The oldest and largest branch of Christianity ruled over by the Pope in Rome.
Protestant	2 nd largest branch of Christianity that is separate from the Catholic church.	dispensation	Permission to ignore or break a rule under special circumstances
Dissolution	A formal, legal ending of something	Armada	A large group of warships
Throne	A position of a king or queen	The Age of Exploration	A time when European nations began exploring the world.
heir	A person who will inherit the throne.	Exploration	the action of exploring an unfamiliar area.

1485 - Henry Tudor is crowned King Henry VII

1509- Henry VII dies. His son Henry VIII

1547 Henry VIII dies. His 9 year old son, Edward becomes king.

1553 Edward VI dies, his cousin Lady Jane Gray takes the throne for just 9 days.

1553 - Mary I takes the throne.

1558 - Mary I dies. Her half-sister Elizabeth I becomes queen.

1588 - The Spanish Armada is defeated by the English.

1603 - Queen Elizabeth dies ending the Tudor reign.
