Phonics is the principal method we use to teach children to decode.





What is decoding?

Decoding is a method of translating print into speech by rapidly matching a letter or combination of letters.

This is an important part of the reading process and forms an essential part for early readers to master to become efficient readers.



What is Phonics?



Introducing children to the joy and wonder of books requires a systematic teaching of phonics.



What is Phonics?



Phonics is a way of teaching children to read and write. It helps children hear, write, identify and use different sounds that distinguish one word from another in the English language.

We use Bug Club Phonics.



Why Bug Club Phonics?



A huge e-book library to give children access to a range of books at home linked to phonemes. Allows for whole class teaching, group and 1:1 teaching.

Enables children to learn spelling, handwriting and early writing skills in a systematic way. Enables children to learn the alphabet, identify letters, phonemes (sounds), multi-syllable words, alternative spellings of phonemes in a systematic way.

Opportunities to re cap and consolidate phonics through phonics games and resources. Good selection of colourful, diverse and varied texts, including fiction and non-fiction.







Phonemes are sounds.

Grapheme is the letter or letters used to form the phoneme i.e

Phoneme is ai, grapheme for ai are the letters a and i.



How is phonics taught at Farnborough?





We teach a systematic and synthetic phonics programme in which phonemes (sounds) associated with particular graphemes (letter(s)) are pronounced in isolation and are blended together (synthesised).



How is phonics taught?



Once children can read the phonemes at a grapheme, word and text level confidently they move to the next phase.

Phase 1 Pre-school

Phase 2

Phase 3

Phase 4

Phase 5

Phase 6 Year One/Year Two







How is phonics taught?

The 44 phonemes are taught in Reception and Year One between Phase 2 and Phase 5.

Once the children are secure with these sounds, alternative spellings of these sounds are introduced.

Blending







- Blending means putting sounds together to say/read the word.
- The child says each phoneme clearly, sometimes more than once to hear the word.
- Most children need practise to blend before applying learnt sounds in words.
- Use robot arms to support blending.

Tricky Words





How is phonics taught Farnborough Primary School?



- Each phase has a set of tricky words.
- Tricky words cannot be blended fully or at all.
- They have to be learnt as sight vocabulary.



How can children be supported at home.



Read often



Read bug club books at least 10 minutes, 5 days a week for phonics progression.





How can children be supported at home.



Additionally Children recap and read through the sound mats (phonemes they have learnt) Read e bug club books. Play sound games – I spy. Sound hunts.

Once in your child's account, go to 'my stuff' where your child's books are displayed. Select a book to read. The book does not have to be completed in one go.








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
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




Bug Club online – always rate the book at the end so the book goes to 'my library' and a new One appears in 'my stuff'.











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Bug Club online

When your child has finished a book, the book will move to 'my library' as long as all bug questions and the ratings emoji are answered. Once the book is in 'my library', the class teacher can see the book is completed. The class teacher can see how many books have been read and how many are available in 'my stuff'. A new set of books can be allocated by the class teacher when needed.









To help your child at school, it is really helpful to regularly write in the reading log with the date, title and comments. If you have any questions about your child's reading; general or specific (how to pronounce a phoneme), please write in reading log for your class teacher.
