

Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Aqueduct	A channel or pipe, sometimes over a bridge, used to carry water over long distance.
Artillery	Weapons such as bows and arrows and catapults.
Auxiliary	A less well-trained soldier, not a Roman citizen.
Cavalry	A soldier who rides a horse into battle.
Celts	People living in Britain and other parts of Europe at the time of the Roman Empire.
Chariot	A cart with two wheels, pulled by horses.
Emperor	The leader of an empire.
Empire	A group of countries led by one leader, or government.
Hypocaust	A Roman method of heating buildings by allowing warm air to flow through gaps between walls and floors.
Latin	The language spoken and written by Romans.
Legionary	A well-trained, well-paid soldier who is a Roman citizen.
Scutum	A Roman soldier's shield.
Stylus	A metal 'pen' for writing onto wax tablets.
Testudo	The Latin word for tortoise, describing the soldier's formation going into battle.
