world and worshipped them through shrines and temples.


The children will look at the legacy of this ancient society and the ways in which they have influenced many other periods of history. From democracy to myths to the Olympics.

Reading

Children will read independently on a daily basis. They will be looking at the comprehension of books every week in Guided Reading sessions including, prediction, summarising, inference and retrieval.
