



## Visits, Visitors and Experience Grid for History



	Trips	Impact
<b>Reception</b>	Farnborough Village Park and High St	Children will look at Locality and talk about the lives of people around them and their roles in society. They will look at buildings and discuss similarities and differences to buildings they know.
<b>Year 1</b>	Transport Museum or Science Museum	Used as an Introduction to the History Curriculum in KS1. It allows the children to experience History first hand, identifying significant figures and events from the topic From wheels to rockets - how has transport changed?
<b>Year 2</b>	London Eye River Cruise	Relates to the Year 2 Topic How has London changed since 1666? Year 2 use this opportunity to look at how Great Fire of London started and how it spread. In the period of time. They will be introduced to significant figures such as King Charles II and Sir Christopher Wren.
<b>Year 3</b>	British Museum Ancient Egypt  Crofton Roman Villas	Relates to the Year 3 Topic 'Why is Tutankhamun so well known?'. The museum provides an insight into the life of Ancient Egyptians. Many sources from that period to study first hand.  Crofton Villas relates to the topic 'What is the impact of the Roman Empire on us today?'. This will help children to have the opportunity to see how the Romans played a part in our local history and what was left behind.

<b>Year 4</b>	National Maritime Museum - Vikings  Golden Hind - Tudors	The Year 4 trip relates to their topic 'Is it fair to say the Vikings were raiders and the Anglo-Saxons were settlers?' The children will have the opportunity to visit the National Maritime Museum and see why and how the vikings came to our shores. They will then visit the Golden Hind when they look at the topic 'Who were the Tudors and what impact did they have on our lives? This will give them an opportunity to look at exploration through the eyes of Sir Francis Drake and the impact it had on lives of the past and lives in present times.
<b>Year 5</b>	British Museum Ancient Greeks  Theatre Group Victorians	The Year 5 trip relates to the Topic 'Has the legacy left by the Ancient Greeks improved our society today?' This trip provides the children with an opportunity to use their investigative skills to find out what the true legacy that was left.  A theatre group experience allows the children see 'Did life improve for all during the Victorian Era?'
<b>Year 6</b>	St Giles Church  St Pauls Cathedral-WW2	The Year 6 trip relates to the Topic 'What is the impact of WW1 on our world today?'. This trip provides an opportunity for the children to look at local History and the effect the Great War had on their local community starting at St Giles Church. Then What is the impact of WW2 on our world today? Look at St Pauls Cathedral and the blitz and the Second Great Fire of London.
