Mathematics

As **mathematicians**, we will be learning about decimals, percentages, algebra and ratio. We will also look at measurement and statistics.

Overview of Topic — World War II




English

Key Skills Covered

- Using speech to convey character and advance the story
- Using paragraphs to organise ideas
- Selecting appropriate vocabulary and grammar for the writing genre, e.g. when to use contracted forms, using passive verbs to present information
- Confidently using a wide range of punctuation, accurately
- Using similes, metaphors and personification to help the reader visualise our settings.
- Using a range of connectives and generalisers, particularly those showing cause and effect.

As **good citizens** we will be looking at Buddha's teachings and thinking about the questions:


Which places have special meaning to Buddhists?
