

Forest School will start after half term and will take place on a Monday afternoon. Please ensure that the red waterproofs ( in a named bag ) and a pair of named wellington boots are in school before this date.	In Reception we start the day with a 5 a Day session - this is a music and movement programme. The children also have a weekly P.E lesson on a Friday. This term we will focus on listening skills and following instructions and yoga.	This is a key area of development in the Early Years curriculum. The children are encouraged to develop their speaking skills through Circle Time sessions, role play activities, story time and general discussion with both their peers and the adults in the classroom. We will also encourage the children to talk about anything you communicate via Parent's Voice which we will be sending out soon.	The children will explore and play with a wide range of media and materials and be provided with lots of opportunities to develop their imagination.
