To further support the children's mathematical development, we will be introducing weekly maths sheets. These activities are designed to embed key number facts and deepen understanding of essential concepts such as addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, and number patterns.

The weekly maths sheets will complement what we are learning in class and are tailored to meet the curriculum expectations for this age group. Regular practice of these skills will help your child develop confidence and fluency in using numbers, which are the foundation for more advanced problem-solving as they progress through school.

Curriculum Expectations

At this age, children are expected to:

In Maths:

- Recall and use basic number facts, such as pairs that make 10 or 20.
- Add and subtract numbers within 20 confidently.
- Begin learning simple multiplication and division facts (e.g., 2x, 5x, and 10x tables).
- · Recognize number patterns and sequences.

Impact on Learning

 Maths sheets reinforce number fact recall and help children see patterns, improving their problem-solving abilities.





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How You Can Support Your Child

We recommend the following strategies to support your child at home:

1. **Exploring Meanings**: Look up definitions together and discuss the meanings of words.

For Maths:

- 1. **Regular Practice**: Encourage your child to complete the weekly maths sheets.
- 2. **Maths Games**: Play games involving number facts, such as "Snap" or "Bingo" with addition and subtraction facts.
- 3. **Real-Life Maths**: Involve your child in real-world tasks, like counting money or measuring ingredients, to show the importance of maths.

Informal assessments in maths will support monitoring their progress in class.
