<p>What are the parts of the body?</p> <p>Why are senses important to us?</p>	body	A body is the physical structure of an animal.		
	senses	There are five senses, they are sight, touch, hearing, smell and taste.		
	animal	An animal is a living thing which moves and eats other animals and plants.		
	nose	The nose tells us if things smell pleasant or unpleasant. A nose gives us our sense of smell.		
	tongue	The tongue tells us if something tastes bitter or sweet. A tongue is used for our sense of taste.		
	eyes	Eyes tell us what things look like. Eyes give us our sense of sight.		
	ears	Ears tell us how things sound. Ears give us our sense of hearing.		
	body, hands and feet.	The body, especially our hands and feet tell us how something feels. Body parts give us our sense of touch.		
	amphibian	An amphibian is cold blooded, lives in the water as babies and on land as they grow older and lays eggs. They have smooth, slimy skin.		
	reptile	Reptiles are cold-blooded, lays eggs and has dry scaly skin and lives on land and in water.

	fish	A fish is cold-blooded, has fins, a tail, lays eggs and uses gills to breathe under water and lives in water.		
	mammal	A mammal is warm-blooded, has hair or fur, a backbone, can breathe air, lives on land and in water and gives birth to their young.		
	carnivore	An animal that eats only meat.		
	herbivore	An animal that eats only plants.		
	omnivore	An animal that eats both plants and meat.
