

#### **Chairperson Report**

#### Introduction:

I am delighted to present the Annual General Meeting report of Farnborough Primary School Parent-Teacher Association for the academic year 2024/25.

Firstly, for those of you who don't know, the PTA is a registered charity, which is therefore governed by the Charity Commission. We are a separate legal entity from the school, and it is the legal responsibility for the Trustees to ensure the charity is well run. We are governed by a constitution, which is our own set of rules. The Trustees, alongside the wider committee are ultimately the decision maker for how PTA funds are spent and to ensure that the funds and other resources are managed responsibly.

2024/25 has been a year of continued growth, renewed engagement, and fantastic community spirit. Despite the ongoing financial pressures many families are facing, our PTA has once again shown that creativity, kindness, and teamwork can go a long way. I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on our accomplishments this year and the future of our PTA.

# **Financial Success:**

I am thrilled to share that we have had a remarkably successful year in terms of fundraising. Our collective efforts have resulted in raising over £6,900. This financial success is a testament to the commitment and support of our parents, teachers, and the school community.

#### **Utilisation of Funds:**

The PTA continues to benefit our children. Our focus this year was sports and exercise, as we funded remarking of the school sports courts, purchased a table tennis table, funded and organised for a gladiator to visit the school, contributed towards new sports kit for the school and funded a school sports flag.

It has been so rewarding seeing the money we have raised in recent years being spent to provide new resources and fun events for the children. With school budgets only tightening we are in discussions with the school to determine the most impactful and beneficial use of the funds we have raised.

#### Highlights of the Year:

Our key successes have been our Christmas market and summer fair once again. The children loved the return of our break the rules day.

A highlight must be the visit from Zach George AKA Steel from The Gladiators, his assembly on the importance of healthy eating, exercise, hydration and mental health was inspiring and the children and parents in the room were very impressed with his walking handstand!

We've also organised a family Bingo night at the school, and the children had an amazing Friday night disco in the spring term where over 80% of pupils attended!



#### **Upcoming Plans:**

We aim to build even further on the funds generated last year and continue making a positive impact on our school community and plans for Autumn term are already in progress.

#### **Treasurer Report:**

It's a pleasure to report that the PTA accounts are in a very healthy position, with over £14,000 currently in the account awaiting allocation to worthy causes to support our children.

This year alone, we have generated more than £10,000 in income – an incredible achievement for a school of our size. Our major fundraising events were the **Summer Fair (£2,814)** and the **Christmas Market (£1,674)**, both of which were not only financial successes but also fantastic opportunities to bring the whole school community together.

Other key contributions came from our **Uniform Sales (£499)** and the ongoing support of **Easyfundraising (£447)**, both of which steadily added to our targets. A full breakdown of events, income, and donations can be found in the annual cashflow summary.

As I step down from my role as Treasurer, I want to say what a genuine pleasure it has been to serve in this position. While the finances are, of course, vital in enabling the PTA to continue its work, the true value of what we do is reflected in the joy and sense of community shared by our children, teachers, and parents through these events.
